2nd Season of Great Midwest Football

Great Midwest football kicks off this week with the second season in conference history with all eight teams in action. Two teams open at home with those games broadcast live on the Great Midwest Digital Network (GMDN), which is available for viewing on Apple TV and Roku. Ohio Dominican, Kentucky Wesleyan and Findlay, get things underway on Thursday night under the lights.

League Notes

- After three teams comprised the league in 2016, the Great Midwest increased membership numbers to eight football-sponsored institutions. Alderson Broaddus, Kentucky Wesleyan and Malone, battled it out for the inaugural G-MAC Championship as AB prevailed against KWC in the clinching game. New to the league this year are Findlay, Hillsdale, Lake Erie, Ohio Dominican and Walsh. Tiffin will join the Great Midwest for the 2018 season.
- Ohio Dominican was the inaugural Great Midwest Preseason Coaches Poll favorite heading into the regular season. The Panthers also received votes in the AFCA Preseason Poll and open up the year on the road in a big one against No. 8 California (PA).
- The Great Midwest is competing as part of NCAA Super Region I along with the Mountain East Conference (MEC), Pennsylvania State Athletics Conference (PSAC) and Northeast-10 Conference (NE-10). Each Super Region will get allocated bids to the NCAA Division II Football Championship.
- Hillsdale's Danny Drummond and Ohio Dominican's Austin Ernst were nominated for the 2017 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team.
- Five players from Great Midwest institutions are currently in NFL Training Camp trying to make the 53-man roster: Jared Veldheer (Hillsdale) on the Arizona Cardinals, Keelan Cole (Kentucky Wesleyan) on the Jacksonville Jaguars, Harold Jones-Quartey (Findlay) on the Chicago Bears, Andre Holmes (Hillsdale) on the Buffalo Bills and Dez Stewart (Ohio Dominican) on the Detroit Lions.
- All Great Midwest home games will be streamed live on the Great Midwest Digital Network (GMDN) courtesy of Stretch Internet.
